This hardbound edition of William Shakespeare's *Hamlet* was published by Roycroft Press, the small-press publishing house at the East Aurora, New York-based artisans community founded by Elbert Hubbard in 1895. The large volume was printed primarily on handmade paper bearing a watermark with the Roycroft name and symbol and has decorative borders on important pages; it is the work of Roycrofters Samuel Warner, Otto Franz, and Andrew Andrews. However, the elegant production of the volume is not the only way that the Roycrofters put their own unique spin on Shakespeare's classic play Not only did Elbert Hubbard see fit to make modifications to Shakespeare's original text; he went so far as to copyright his changes.^{*} The book is in very good condition with some wear to the binding commensurate with age.
