A short history of the vehicle from animal-drawn carts to early-twentieth century automobiles, accompanied by numerous illustrations showing the evolution of the vehicle in its many and varied forms. A twenty-first-century reader, for whom the word "vehicle" is most likely synonymous with "car", will be very surprised by the many and varied forms of transportation that can be associated with that word, from human-powered sedan chairs to bicycles or hobbyhorses to steam engines. The book has over one hundred plates, including some tipped-in color images. All reproduce works of art in important private and museum collections. This volume has an attractive, sage-green cover with gilt lettering, as well as eye-catching, orange-and-white endpapers depicting some of the vehicles described and illustrated in the book.
