

OFFICIALLY-PUBLISHED GOVERNMENT TRANSCRIPTS FROM HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES HEARINGS REGARDING FALLOUT FROM THE PENTAGON PAPERS' PUBLICATION

When leaked to the press in 1971, the U.S. government's Vietnam War study, often called the "Pentagon Papers", was shocking and highly controversial. Although those responsible for the leak were initially charged with espionage, the Pentagon Papers were allowed to be published later in 1971 and were fully de-classified in 2011.* The entire event raised questions about freedom of speech, information, and the press that still resonate today. This three-volume set records seven days of U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Government Operations hearings (June 23-25, June 28-39, & June 30-July 7, 1971) regarding the publication and its far-reaching implications.
