The November 22, 1963 assassination of United States President John F. Kennedy (1917-1963) was one of the most sensational events in post-World War Two American history. It is still often speculated about today. Shortly after Kennedy's death, U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson appointed a committee to investigate and report of the events of that fateful day. The President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy (often called the Warren Commission) issued its final report on September 24, 1964. That report, which is still a matter of widespread contention today, appears in its final form in a official U.S. Government hardcover publication adorned with an embossed and gilt Presidential seal. It includes photographs and reproductions of documents submitted into evidence, as well as a facsimile of the report's official cover letter signed by every committee member. The book is in near mint condition.
